No-one wants cuts in services, but your Lib Dem councillors believe that in the present economic climate it's really important that the council conducts its affairs in line with what residents say is important to them.

Manor Park adoption - progress at last

Work has now started on the necessary modifications to the bus lane on Manor Park. Once this is complete there should be no further obstacle to adoption of the roads by Surrey County Council, subject to the developer paying the required fees.

After a 10 year wait, adoption could now happen by Christmas.

New teenage play area in Court Rec.



After years of campaigning by Lib Dem councillors, play equipment for teenagers has been installed in Court Rec. For years Cllr Jonathan Lees reminded the council about the funds for this, which came from the insurance on the burnt out Dojo.

Cllr Lees said "I'm really pleased we have finally seen something happen. Whilst small, this equipment provides something for teenagers in one of our parks. Combined with a great new children's playground, the council is finally meeting some of our residents' priorities. It's a shame we had to spend so long arguing with Residents Association councillors, who wanted to divert this money into the council's general funds!"

West Park - more homes, no hotel



An additional 83 homes are planned at West Park, after the developers have given up trying to find a potential operator for the proposed hotel and conference centre.

If approved, this will bring the total to 452 new homes.

The proposal will still leave significant parts of the site in use by the NHS for offices and laboratories, and other facilities including the new Epsom Cottage Hospital, as well as a lot of open space.
